After providing a brief overview of government ethics laws in Canada, Ian will explain why the federal laws stand apart from those at other levels of government. He will analyze Justin Trudeau's actions in the Aga-Khan and SNC-Lavalin affairs, ask what has been learned from those high-profile breaches and consider why there seem to be no consequences for violating these wellestablished laws. Finally, Ian will expose some of the biggest deficiencies in Canada's federal government ethics regime and present some possible solutions. Discussion to follow.
