COVID-19 and Injustices Experienced by Children & Youth

In this presentation we will examine some of the impacts that children & youth within Canada and internationally have experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It will seek to motivate an exploration of the question: what have the moral experiences of children and youth looked like in COVID-19 and in what ways have children and youth been treated impermissibly during the pandemic? The answer to this question provided in this talk relies on justice-based perspectives to: (a) highlight where and how young people have faced moral wrongdoing by pandemic responses and (b) to provide a lens through which the pandemic experiences of children and youth can be framed.

SYDNEY CAMPBELL is a PhD Candidate studying health policy in the Institute of Health Policy, Management & Evaluation at the University of Toronto, and simultaneously completing a Collaborative Specialization in Bioethics through the University of Toronto's Joint Centre for Bioethics. She works as a research assistant with the VOICE Childhood Ethics team, led by Dr. Franco Carnevale, at McGill University.
